How to use this

This support pack contains all you need to write music with your Skoog. Notes in this Score Notation Pack are arranged by their colour. In this pack you will find five folders labelled with the colours corresponding to those on your Skoog. Inside each of these folders, you will find a bunch of .png files - the notes - of the same colour, but of different lengths. The Note Chart on the next page will guide you which length to use.

You will also find a folder of templates - compatible with both Mac and Windows computers. This instruction manual will guide you how to use these files to create your very own printable Scores.

Create your Score

1. Open the Templates folder - you will find the following:

[Score.template](#) - for Apple Pages

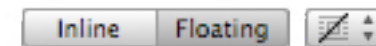
[ScoreTemplate.docx](#) - for Microsoft Word

[ScoreTemplate.dotx](#) - template file for Microsoft Word

So select and open the file that is compatible with your computer system.

2. Let's say we want to add a [red note](#) that is 2 beats long - from the Note Chart on the previous page, we know that this is called a [Minim](#) - so open up the Red folder and select the [Red Minim](#) .png file.
3. Drag the .png file over to the template file that you have opened in either Apple Pages or Microsoft Word, and drop it between the grey lines:

4. Now select the note and check that it has the correct Object Placement settings for moving it about. For [Apple Pages](#) user, make sure [Floating](#) and [None](#) are selected for the Object Placement settings on the toolbar:



And for [Microsoft Word](#), right click on the .png image, select the Layout tab, and make sure In front of text is selected:

5. Position the note so that it aligns with the beginning of the line (or with the previous note):

On the Keyboard Tab in the Skoogmusic software, open the notes file: `FileName`



6. Select and edit the text - this includes the [song title](#), the [artist name](#) and the [note name](#) for each of the sides on your Skoog (eg. A4 for the red side, C3 for green etc...These note names can be found on the [Notes/Scales Menu/Notes Tab](#), in the Skoogmusic app).
7. Save the file and print it out - now you have your very own Skoog Score! Let us know what amazing tunes you come up with this Score Notation Pack - we love hearing about what you get up to with your Skoog!
